FALL FORUM: Thanks to Chapter 26 for hosting the Fall Forum in sunny Tampa, Florida, last October. Listed below is an overview of items discussed:

IRWA'S Four Key Objectives for 2014:

- 1. Increase IRWA membership
- 2. Increase relevance of IRWA education/credentials
- 3. Increase IRWA marketing outreach
- 4. Strengthen the infrastructure of the Association

Alignment Project: IRWA has established a new communication model that focuses on the four primary industries it serves and the Communities of Practice within those industries in order to expand its ability to deliver value and industry relevance in the marketplace.

The four Industry Committees are:

- 1. Electric and Utilities
- 2. Local Public Agencies
- 3. Oil and Gas Pipelines
- 4. Transportation

Communities of Practice within those committees are defined as:

- 1. Acquisition
- 2. Asset Management
- 3. Environmental
- 4. Relocation
- 5. Surveying/Engineering
- 6. Title
- 7. Valuation

Young Professionals: IRWA will no longer use this moniker. Topics for future discussion include:

RWIEF: The IEC unveiled a new 5-year plan to develop 50 new educational products at a cost of \$1,200,000. To achieve this goal, the IEC proposed that each chapter contribute \$4,000/yr for the next 5 years to the Right of Way International Education Foundation.
