ABOUT OUR OFFICE:

The Tennessee Office of the Comptroller of Treasury is a state agency based in Nashville, TN that offers employees an opportunity to have an impact on the lives of Tennesseans. Our office is focused on being the intellectual firepower and conscience of State government and is known for positively influencing Tennessee's financial health. We are looking for individuals who want to be challenged, make things work better, and possess a work ethic and sense of professional responsibility that matches our own.

POSITION:

The Comptroller's Office of State Assessed Properties serves as the state's "96th Assessor" by conducting annual appraisals, assessments, and audits of public utility and transportation properties. We are looking for a Real Property Supervisor with fee appraisal experience who will oversee the professional inspection, supervision and administration of Public Utility and Transportation real property appraisals. To qualify for consideration, an applicant should have graduated from an accredited college or university with a Bachelor's degree in related financial and economic coursework and/or possess 10 or more years of relevant experience. Applicants must hold one of the following appraisal designations: CAE, MAI, SPRA, SREA, RM, SR/WA, RES or a Certified General Real Estate Appraiser license issued by the Tennessee Department of Commerce and Insurance. Other combinations of education/experience, if evaluated as equivalent, may qualify an applicant for consideration.

To perform this job successfully, candidates should possess excellent communication skills and be able to utilize tact and diplomacy in all interactions. Candidates should have the ability to lead, coach, and empower staff to maintain and improve a service-orientated culture that supports customers and leadership in office endeavors. Successful employees will be innovative, take personal responsibility to get results, and adapt to changing priorities and deadlines while maintaining accuracy and consistency.

Major responsibilities for this position will include:

- Complying with applicable state laws by conducting valuations and appraisals on the companies assessed by the office.
- Coordinating with the Director and Manager for county reappraisals.
- Conducting research to verify appraisal information, including using market value land and improvement studies, deeds, surveys, sales external appraisals, Ad Valorem reports and any other data supporting and/or estimating value.
- Overseeing the analyst's use of appraisal information and additional research to apply the appropriate assessment ratio, add personal property and intangibles, and determine an accurate assessment.
- Building and using an advanced mastery of the IMPACT system and ancillary components as it relates to real property utilizing generally accepted appraisal principles.
- Making physical inspections of assessable properties utilizing generally accepted appraisal principles.
